

Title: AM-53-1 to R6: European Greens Demand Urgent

Action to Protect Civilians in Sudan

Tabled by: Green Party of England and Wales

Resolution text

Insert from line 52 to 57:

- Sanction all individuals and entities responsible for arms transfers,
 financing, or enabling atrocities, including those operating through shell
 companies, gold supply chains, and foreign mercenary networks.
- Apply targeted asset freezes and travel bans to RSF and SAF leadership implicated in war crimes and ensure these sanctions are harmonised across EU Member States.
- Expand resettlement programmes, ensure access to asylum, end forced returns, and investigate abuses committed by border authorities, including racial profiling and violent pushbacks. Ensure that Sudanese refugees have access to fair asylum procedures and protection within the EU, and prohibit the externalisation of asylum processing to unsafe third countries.

Insert from line 59 to 60:

 bring together regional and international actors to restore a coherent mediation framework aligned wtih African-led peace efforts.

From line 63 to 70:

- recognise Recognise environmental degradation as a driver and consequence of conflict, and integrate climate justice into all humanitarian and peace-building strategies.
- Ensure EU mandatory due diligence legislation covering raw materials from Sudan to interrupt supply chains linked to RSF financing, including gold, gum arabic, and agricultural exports. Sanctions must also target transnational gold traders, private military contractors, and mercentary networks profiting from Sudan's conflict economy.
- Ensure accountability for corporations contributing to environmental destruction or benefiting from conflict-related exploitation.
- Work towards and finance climate adaptation initiatives for displacementaffected regions with community-led design and implementation.
