Freedom to Live Better: Building a Green and Social Europe

- 2 A warm home in a safe community.
- 3 A diverse society where everyone's rights are respected.
- 4 An A strong EU united for international law and global coalitions on climate, health and
- 5 nature.
- 6 A leader in the green transition pursuing ambitious targets in line with the Paris agreement.
- 7 A society that proves that social justice, green transition and competitiveness can go hand in hand.
- 8 A caring society that finds solutions to everyday problems.
- 9 This is where the EU can and should be going.
- 10 Yet when people wake up, they see a world out of control. One day, President
- 11 Trump imposes tariffs on long-standing allies. The next, wildfires rip through
- 12 homes, and while disinformation, one of the most serious threats to European democracy, social trust and
- 13 security spreads rapidly and poisons politics.
- 14 This stream of crises is not random. It is the most serious ideological
- 15 challenge the EU has faced. The MAGA White House, Europe's far-right radicals, an ever more aggressive China,
- 16 and Putin's blood-soaked regime share an agenda: to undermine everything the
- 17 European project stands for. Our own divisions and the fragmentation of our single market, as well as a lack of
- 18 coherent industrial policies and investments strategies, leave our businesses more and more behind in the race-
- 19 for future sustainable industries and businesses.
- 20 The EU is a political community built on human dignity, freedom, democracy, the
- 21 rule of law, and respect for human rights. Globally, it stands up to the Big
- 22 Tech and fossil fuel lobbies. This is why today it is under attack.
- 23 This attack started on the extremes but is taking hold of the- Currently, however, authoritarian forces are
- 24 increasing their influence on political forces leading the EU:
- The European People's Party is doing the has shown itself willing to work with the far right to dirty
- 26 work by undermineing climate protection, social rights, justice, rule of law and democratic principles
- 27 Even some allies are giving up on the Green Deal, compromising our future
- 28 for short-term gain
- 29 The European Commission is abandoning green and social progress with ← □
- 30 must defend green and social progress against short-sighted deregulation, leaving-that would leave
- 31 much of society and the business community behind. Key elements of the European Green Deal are
- under attack and the EU has caved into direct pressure from the US.
- 33 Backsliding has global consequences: the EU lacked the ambition to push forward a transformative
- 34 global climate agreement at COP 30 in Belém.

36 This dangerous game led to an unprecedented low point. With the vote on weakening the corporate

- 37 sustainable due diligence legislation, the EPP inexcusably broke the cordon sanitaire, counting on a
- majority with the extreme right to pressure and blackmail the pro-European, democratic groups into
- 39 following the EPP line instead of negotiating a compromise. This calculated decision marks a dangerous
- 40 turning point bringing chaos and instability at a time when the EU needs to act in unity.

- 42 We face a critical choice. Pursue the far-right's destructive, anti-European
- 43 agenda or fight for a free Europe. We need a Europe united to protect itself against military and hybrid threats
- 44 as well as act for peace with civil means. This includes strong cooperation with like-minded allies and building
- 45 European preparedness combining both conventional and civilian approaches. Ending Russia's aggression is
- 46 essential for ensuring a peaceful, democratic, and green Europe in the long term.
- 47 We stand in full solidarity with Ukraine, which must be able to defend itself and negotiate from a position of
- 48 strength. There must be nothing about Ukraine without Ukraine and we demand a peace based on sovereignty,
- 49 self-determination, and territorial integrity.
- 50 What does a free Europe mean? For us it means, A a Europe that focuses on real and fair solutions
- 51 to the shared problems. making our lives insecure. Because wA Europe that invests together in a competitive
- 52 green and social economy. We are strongest when
- 53 we stand in solidarity., as in the pandemic and the energy crisis.
- 54 It means freedom from expensive imported and unsustainable energy and unaffordable rents. It means
- 55 freedom from distorted elections and hybrid threats. Most-simply importantly, it means the
- 56 freedom to live in a community where everyone looks out for each other.

57 The Time Is Now

- 58 This is why we are fighting for the next step in European integration. The time
- 59 for excuses and half-measures is over. Europe cannot wait.
- 60 We call on all pro-European forces to work together and take responsibility. We
- 61 need investment to reduce the cost of living and protect our climate. We need to
- 62 safeguard shrinking democratic space and act with unity in an insecure world.
- 63 We need to make the European Green Deal the basis for our future shared
- 64 prosperity, not roll back our environmental and social commitments. We are committed to keeping our European
- 65 industry in Europe and supporting it through the green transition. We also call for reinforcing the 'Buy European'
- 66 approach to increase our strategic autonomy and secure shorter, more sustainable supply chains
- 67 Our own divisions and the fragmentation of our single market, as well as a lack of coherent industrial policies
- 68 and investments strategies, leave our businesses more and more behind in the race for future sustainable
- 69 industries and businesses.
- 70 We need massive investment in the just transition: that means an ambitious next
- 71 EU budget, joint borrowing and reformed fiscal rules.
- 72 We need a reformed EU that takes democratic decisions without being held back by
- 73 national vetoes.

78 79	Build a fully circular economy: the clean tech revolution can re-industrialize Europe, create well-paying jobs, and drive innovation
80	Ensure clean air, food, and water free from toxic pollutants
81 82 83	Accelerate efforts to restore and protect biodiversity, ecosystems, and nature, in line with the EU Biodiversity Strategy and the Montreal/Kunming protocol, also recognising that healthy nature is essential for human wellbeing and climate resilience
84 85	Implement stronger protection for European industry against imports that are manufactured without comparable environmental, social or labour standards, including from the United States and China.
86 87	Develop a common "Buy European" approach to ensure sustainable production, protection of labour standards, fair competition and the long-term resilience of our economy
88 89	Ensure access to quality public goods: from renewable energy to affordable and sustainable housing
90 91	Ensure Guarantee decent employment, fair wages and workers' rights and make the ultra-rich, multinationals and polluters pay their fair share
92 93	Invest in resilience to protect people, nature, and infrastructure from extreme weather
94 95	Continue to deepen the Single Market so that European businesses can unleash their potential for innovative, green products, whilst protecting social rights
96 97	Implement economic or fiscal tools to discourage the distribution of dividends and encourage investments
98	Develop coherent green industrial policies and sustainable investment strategies

100 101	Upholds the protection-from online hate, against disinformation and manipulation that civil society fought for by enforcing European law

114	recognises the right to self-determination of Palestinians and Israelis, works towards a just political
115	solution for a lasting peace, including the immediate recognition of the State of Palestine, as an
116	important step towards the two-state solution, advocates for the dismantling of all oppressive systems
117	of apartheid and illegal occupation, as stated in the advisory opinion of the International Court of
118	Justice. Stands for peace and justice in the Middle East and recognises the state
119	of Palestine to secure a two-state solution guaranteeing the rights and +1
120	security of both peoples
121	Accounts for war crimes and the genocide against the Palestinian people 1
122 123	Continues to stand in solidarity with Ukraine against Russia's illegal war of aggression
124 125	Supports Ukraine's struggle as a defence of freedom, peace and European security and its future in within the EU
126	Insists that Ukraine and Europe are fully represented in all negotiations on ending the war.
127	Helps Ukraine in documenting and prosecuting the full scale of Russia's crimes, including war crimes,
128	crimes against humanity, the abduction and forced transfer of Ukrainian children, and the deliberate
129	destruction of nature amounting to ecocide
130 131	Insists that Russia pays for the damage it has caused, including through the use of frozen Russian assets, in line with international law
132	Continues to stand in solidarity with the Sudanese civilians, refugees and the country's civil society as
133	well as supporting all humanitarian aids programs and diplomatic efforts, and condemns the United
134	Arab Emirates' support to Rapid Support Forces
135	Continues to stand in solidarity with the civilians living in North Kivu and South Kivu, Democratic
136	Republic of Congo (DRC) threatened by M23 armed group as well as supporting all humanitarian aids
137	programs and diplomatic efforts
138	Deepens security and resilience cooperation on capabilities, synergies and
139	enhanced crisis preparedness, grounded in a human security approach, recognising that effective
140	defence and deterrence as well as diplomacy and peacebuilding are environmentally responsible in the
141	long term, as they prevent the devastating ecological and climate impacts of war
142	Defends a migration policy based on fundamental rights and solidarity so
143	European countries remain havens for those fleeing war and persecution
144	Reinforces international law and strengthens institutions such as the International Criminal Court, the
145	United Nations, the Council of Europe and EU human rights instruments as guarantees of democracy
146	and security
